## PRESIDING BISHOP'S EPISTLE

Praised be Jesus Christ!

A blessed new year of grace and salvation to you all – and greetings to all of you, beloved in the Lord. After another seemingly-long hiatus in writing to you, it is a welcome opportunity and privilege in this sixth Presiding Bishop's Epistle to share with all of you an update about recent goings-on in our part of the Household of Faith, and to provide information on future events. It remains the joy of a lifetime to offer pastoral care and support to and for you, to travel throughout the Eastern United States and North America, to visit and cheer as many of our churches and faithful as possible, and to bear witness in person to the health and growth of our Church's communion. In my daily prayers, I praise God for all of you.

## The 2024 Lenten Appeal – Saint Dunstan's Academy

We ask for your support of the 2024 APA Lenten Appeal on behalf of Saint Dunstan's Academy in Roseland, Nelson County, Virginia, the first residential school for young men in the history of the Continuing Church. With the creation of Saint Dunstan's Academy comes the renewal of the great Anglican tradition of residential education in community. This boarding school for high school boys is dedicated to Christian formation in the Anglican Tradition alongside an education in the classics, in agriculture, and in skilled trades. Saint Dunstan's Academy will provide an intensive and nurturing academic, intellectual, spiritual, and practical formation for young men in their most vigorous high school years, with programmes available for men in their 'gap year' before undergraduate college studies. Saint Dunstan's is an academic institution like no other in Anglicanism.

It is our goal this year to raise \$150,000 for the Academy. This collection will enable the Academy to begin with its first class later this year. A successful Lenten Appeal will enable Saint Dunstan's to build a bunkhouse to house the first cohort of students.

We have a unique opportunity to support a ministry that is geared to raise up a whole new generation of young men

committed to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and our Catholic and Anglican Faith. From Saint Dunstan's Academy, many future vocations to Christian service, including Holy Orders and the Religious Life, will be cultivated. Saint Dunstan's trailblazing vision has drawn attention throughout Anglicanism in North America and throughout the world of classical education. May our Saviour bless you as you prayerfully consider your financial support for this distinctive and all-important project. Please be generous!

I shall be joined by the DEUS Board of Examining Chaplains and other APA speakers for a presentation and open discussion about the present and future of the Continuing Church. ## News Notes for latter 2023 and early 2024

Delayed because of ongoing construction, the blessing and dedication of the new building at Saint Matthias Church, Dothan, Alabama occurred with great rejoicing on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> September. The following day, the institution of the Reverend Father Stephen Michael Miller as Rector of Saint Matthias took place on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> October. Please pray for Father Steve and his family as he begins his new ministry.

Father Steve serves as the first Rector in the history of Saint Matthias, as it now enjoys parish status.

The annual Diocesan Synod of the Eastern United States and the Provincial Synod of the Anglican Province of America were held at the third Anglican Joint Synods (G3) from 9th to 14th October 2023 in Orlando, Florida. What a truly happy and celebratory time it was for us all! Our Diocesan and Provincial Synods heard supernal presentations on the new Book of Common Prayer Morning and Evening Prayer application, the new building complex at Saint Barnabas Cathedral, Atlanta, Georgia, Saint Dunstan's Academy, Nelson County, Virginia, the new building at Saint Matthias Church, Dothan, Alabama, the new mission of Christ Church, Florence, Kentucky, the new building at Saint Patrick's Church, Brevard, North Carolina, the building addition at Saint James on-the-Glebe Church, Gloucester, Virginia, and the Classical School of All Saints Church, Mills River, North Carolina.

The Joint Synods featured special presentations, teaching, and conversation on the current state of the Continuing Church and the ways by which we can renew mission building, priestly vocations, and Church expansion in the future. I participated in a public panel regarding these prescient and meaningful deliberations and presented two papers, one on the present condition of the Church and our need for revitalisation, and another on the highly-effective APA formation process for Holy Orders. It was by all accounts a successful and productive Joint Synods assembly. Our Diocesan Synod 2024 will be held in Greensboro, North Carolina.

On Wednesday 18th October, the Reverend Mister Ian Patrick Jarrells was ordained to the Sacred Order of Deacons at Saint Philip's Church, Blacksburg, Virginia for service at Saint Thomas the Apostle Church in Alto, Georgia. Father Ian's new ministry is already bearing fruit in north Georgia. An investigative trip then ensued to beautiful Lewisburg, West Virginia on 19th October to scout out the location for our new mission, Saint John the Baptist Church, which congregation is now organising in that breathtaking region of southern West Virginia. More information on Saint John the Baptist is forthcoming.

On the weekend of  $21^{st}$  and  $22^{nd}$  October, I was delighted to visit Saint John's Church, Greensboro, North Carolina to join the parish for its  $25^{th}$  anniversary celebration. Over recent years, Saint John's has continued exponentially to

grow numerically and spiritually. Plans are now underway for a future building expansion.

A remarkable advance for Christian and Catholic unity has been achieved at All Souls' Church in Asheboro, North Carolina, where I visited from 28th to 29th October. After years of consideration and careful reflection, the former Saint Andrew's Church (Reformed Episcopal Church) has chosen to unite with All Souls' and to affiliate with the mission and our Diocese and Province. The union almost doubles the membership of All Souls' and brings the mission much closer to parish status, a goal which we hope will be reached in the coming year. *Ut unum sint*. I shall return to All Souls' on 25th February officially to welcome all the new members.

It is always a pleasure to visit All Saints Church, Mills River, North Carolina, which I did on the weekend of 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> November. Once more this past year it was a treat to return to the Diocesan Women's Retreat from 8<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> November at the Monastery of Our Lady of the Holy Spirit in Conyers, Georgia to serve as retreat conductor. Our theme was the theology of the temple and temple worship in biblical revelation.

The online Synod of the Diocese of the Central and Western States was held on 18th November - and I was excited to bring greetings and words of encouragement to that august meeting on behalf of the entire Province. It was splendid to visit Saint Peter's Church, Kingsport, Tennessee on 9th and 10th December.

From 11<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> December, the Domestic Missions Team met in Abingdon, Virginia at the exceptionally comfortable and hospitable Jubilee House Retreat Centre to discuss the ongoing missionary work and strategy of our Diocese. It was the most inspiring, aspirational, and creative meeting to date, replete with excellent ideas and plans for greater missionary effort. I wish to thank Canon Wade Miller, Father Scott Greene, Father Kevin Fife, Father Steve Miller, and Father Mark Perkins for their ministry in service to our Diocese and Province.

On Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> December, the Reverend Father Briane Keith Turley was ordained to the Sacred Order of Priests (*sub conditione*) at Saint Philip's Church, Blacksburg, Virginia for service at the new Saint John the Baptist Church in Lewisburg, West Virginia. Father Briane brings with him into the APA a cornucopia of academic brilliance, wisdom, and practical and pastoral experience – he has served in the

priesthood for many years and is a Professor of Religion at West Virginia University.

After a brief delay because of cold and ice, the institution of the Reverend Father Sean Edwards McDermott as Rector of All Saints' Church, Charlottesville, Virginia occurred on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> January, along with the annual episcopal visitation. We thank Our Lord for the new ministry of Father Sean and his family, as we also give thanks for the faithful and unwavering service of the Reverend Canon Glenn M. Spencer and his wife Ann over a 32-year span at All Saints' Church as Father Glenn retires. All Saints' Charlottesville stands out as an epicentre for our common life and labour in the APA.

A jovial and engaging time ensued with an episcopal visitation to Saint Matthew's Church, Weaverville, North Carolina on 14th January. On 17th-18th January, the ninth meeting of the Anglican Joint Synods (G3) – Polish National Catholic Church Dialogue transpired over Zoom and in person in Charleston, South Carolina. The Dialogue is, rather unexpectedly, again making strides and deserves your prayers. Please keep this intention in your intercessions.

From  $19^{th}$  to  $21^{st}$  January, I was overjoyed to make a first official episcopal visitation to the truly glorious Saint Mark's Church, Vero Beach, Florida. Following that trip, Canon Wade Miller and I ventured on a fascinating and illuminating fact-finding journey to Louisiana, including jaunts into east Texas and Mississippi, from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> January. A significant missionary development has established itself in Louisiana, and soon we shall have a great deal more to say about this one mission Church plant in particular. Please stay tuned.

## February and March 2024

Another first as your Presiding Bishop will occur from 9th to 11th February, when I shall be altogether thrilled to make my first official visitation to Saint Alban's Cathedral in Oviedo, Florida. Upon my visitation, it will be my profound delight officially to declare the Most Reverend Walter Howard Grundorf, DD, to be Presiding Bishop Emeritus of the Province and Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese. It will be lovely to return to several other parishes soon - All Saints' Parish, Wilmington, North Carolina, on 17th and 18th February, Saint Philip's Church, Blacksburg, Virginia on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> March, and Saint Patrick's Church, Brevard, North Carolina, on 9th and 10th March.

And then yet another first is scheduled from  $12^{th}$  to  $15^{th}$  March. I have been invited by the Dean and administration to

visit for the first time in my life the famous Nashotah House Theological Seminary in Nashotah, Wisconsin. It will be an intense honour to preach before the student body and faculty of the Seminary and to have a few days to experience the unique life and formation proffered by Nashotah House. We trust that this impending sojourn will only deepen and strengthen the good relationship we already have with 'the House,

### **April 2024**

April travels will conclude with episcopal visitations to Saint James-on-the-Glebe Church, Gloucester, Virginia from the 13<sup>th</sup> to the 14<sup>th</sup> for the blessing and dedication of its new expanded chapel, which space has dramatically increased the capacity for worshippers, and Saint Paul's Church and Classical School in Melbourne, Florida from the 27<sup>th</sup> to the 28th.

Annual Parish Reports: Due March 1, 2024
As required by APA Canon 43, all churches in the Province are to turn in their annual Parochial Reports (Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 2023) to their Bishop Ordinary. The deadline is March 1 each year. All forms must be submitted online via the APA website at <u>www.anglicanprovince.org</u> under the "Resources" tab and "Parish Reports." A <u>worksheet</u> to prepare answers before entering online is also available on the website. The online form will automatically send the parish data to the APA office and send a copy to the church email address used for submission. The church data will be forwarded to the Bishop Ordinary for each diocese.

Non-parochial Clergy Reporting by March 1
As a non-parochial priest not in charge of a parish, the APA Canons state that you must give a report at least yearly to your Diocesan Bishop. (Canon 43, Section 1 of the APA Canons reads in part: "And every Minister not in charge of any Parish or Congregation shall also report his occasional services and if there have been none, the causes or reasons which have prevented the same.") This does not have to be a formal letter, as an email will suffice.

Please include your most current email and physical mailing address and phone (s) so we can ensure our records are accurate. We would enjoy and appreciate hearing from you.
